REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

Today's Gospel continues the themes of God's providence and true faith. The first half of the reading presents an example of false piety. The scribes go about seeking earthly recognition and respect while neglecting their spiritual lives. They recite lengthy prayers to attract the attention of those around them, seeking to appear pious and earn the respect of humans. They do not pray in order to glorify God or as a means of working on and improving upon their relationship with God.

Jesus accuses the scribes of devouring widows' houses. Widows were among the most vulnerable of society because they had limited means of income and did not always have someone to advocate for them if they were being taken advantage of. There are many injunctions in the Old Testament against exploiting widows (for example, Isaiah 10:1-2; Jeremiah 7:6: Ezekiel 22:7), yet this is what the scribes are doing. Jesus assures the crowds that such people will eventually receive divine justice for their actions.

The second half of today's Gospel presents an example of true piety. Jesus reveals His supernatural knowledge of what lies in the hearts of people when He tells His disciples that the poor widow gave "all she had", withholding nothing from God. She could have kept one coin back for herself, but instead she gave it all to the Lord. She is like the widow of Zarephath from the first reading, withholding nothing, although in this instance there is no promise of continued provision.

Today's readings invite us to examine our lives. Do we give everything over to God, not just financially, but also our time, our worries, our joys, our prayer life? Do we accept Jesus' all-giving sacrifice in our daily lives, sharing His love with others?




Why Does the Church Canonize People | Angels

SCRIPTURE INSIGHTS: 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B

This week's readings emphasize faith, sacrifice, and trust in God. These themes help us reflect on our relationship with God and others

- **Trust in God's Plan:** In 1 Kings 17:10-16, the widow trusts Elijah's word from God and is blessed with food. This shows that trusting God's plan brings blessings.
- **Generosity in Poverty:** The widow in Mark 12:38-44 gives all she has. Her generosity shows that true giving comes from the heart, not from ex-
- Sacrifice: Hebrews 9:24-28 speaks about Jesus' sacrifice. Jesus' offering of Himself is the ultimate act of love and service.
- **Humility:** Jesus criticizes the scribes in Mark 12:38-44 for their pride. Humility is important inour relationship with God and others.
- **Faith in God's promises:** The widow in 1 Kings 17:10-16 acts on faith. Believing in God's promises leads to unexpected blessings.
- **Jesus as the mediator:** Hebrews 9:24-28 describes Jesus as the mediator between God and humanity. This emphasizes the importance of Jesus in our salvation.
- **True wealth:** The story of the widow's mite in Mark 12:38-44 shows that true wealth is not measured by money. It's about giving and trusting in God.
- **Obedience to God:** Elijah asks the widow to make bread in 1 Kings 17:10 -16, and she obeys. Her obedience leads to God providing for her needs.

This weeks readings remind us of the importance of trust, faith, and humility in our lives. Reflecting on these themes can strengthen our relationship with God and guide us in our daily actions. (Young-Catholics.com)
