WORD REFLECTING ΟΝ GOD'S

When continuing to celebrate Jesus' resurrection during Easter Time, today's Gospel reminds us that Jesus is our good shepherd who carefully guides and protects us so that we might receive the promise of eternal life. Accordingly, we often call this "Good Shepherd Sunday."

By calling his followers sheep, Jesus highlights a common pastoral image. Sheep and shepherds enjoy a close bond. Sheep learn the voice of their shepherd and follow it because the shepherd gives them frequent reasons to trust. To shepherd successfully, then, requires effort on the shepherd's part. Shepherds must assure the sheep that, when they bleat, they will be heard and receive care. To build such confidence and trust, s shepherd must get to know the sheep. For Jesus, whose purpose is to serve and care for his sheep, a simple, direct claim suffices: "I know them." In this statement, Jesus confirms his commitment to hand the fulfillment of his shepherding role.

Yet sheep, dependent as they are, must develop confidence in the shepherd's claim of care. For sheep to respond to Jesus with docility-to hear his voice and follow him willinglythey must be familiar with his voice. Thus, Jesus engages in a protracted public ministry in which he teaches and heals. His aim is to generate confidence in his words and deeds. In our contemporary context, we maintain confidence in Christ's care for us by regularly participating in sacraments, reading Scripture, maintaining a personal prayer life, and reflecting on Jesus' life. In doing so, we hope to foster an openness within ourselves to Jesus' call for our lives and a willingness to respond to it generously.

Jesus further indicates the strength of his care by employing a second image, that of a firm grip and being held in strong hands. In using this imagery, Jesus appeals to a standard biblical image of God's power; throughout the Old Testament, the hands of the Lord represent and express divine power. Here, as these hands are associated with shepherding, they further our confidence in the way Jesus holds and protects the sheep entrusted to his care. 

SCRIPTURE INSIGHTS: Themes 4th Sunday of Easter, Year C

This Sunday's readings illustrate various dimensions of love as the core of Christian identity. Each of these themes point back to the fundamental truth that God is love, and our lives should reflect this reality.

- Jesus as Shepherd: Jesus calls Himself the Good Shepherd who knows His sheep. This shows His care and protection for us.
- Listening to Jesus: Jesus says His sheep hear His voice. We are called to listen to His teachings and follow His guidance.
- Salvation for All: In Revelation, a great multitude stands before God. This emphasizes that salvation is offered to everyone.
- **Faithful Witnesses:** Paul and Barnabas speak boldly about Jesus in Acts. They show us the importance of spreading the Good News.
- **Eternal Life:** Jesus promises eternal life to His followers. This reminds us of the hope and reward of following Him.
