GOD'S REFLECTING **O**N WORD

Luke's familiar parable of the good Samaritan emerges from a debate between Jesus and a scholar of Torah (the law). In contemporary terms we can call this man a lawyer. The debate is about attaining eternal life through the law. Such debates, were commonplace in first-century Judaism. They sought to help participants make advances in understanding the truth of Torah. In many places, the practice remains normative in Jewish education today.

Returning our attention to the Gospel, it is clear the scholar knows that the heart of the law is the double-love commandment or golden rule: love God and love neighbor. In fact, he identifies these twin commandments by citing them exactly as they appear in the Torah (see Deuteronomy 6:4-5 and Leviticus 19:18). But such knowledge would have been fairly common for a scholar of scriptural law at that time (as it is today). The real question, as the scholar notes, is the scope of the law, especially when it is applied to other people. Loving God with our entire being makes clear, plain sense to him. His question draws attention to the second part of the law, as he asks, "Who is my neighbor?"

In response, Jesus demonstrates his masterful teaching capacity by telling a story and then turning the question back on his interlocutor. The story invites the lawyer to imagine a reasonable, albeit unfortunate scene: a man falls victim to robbers and lies near death on a roadside. Expected protagonists, a priest and a Levite, avoid the victim. But an expected antagonist, a Samaritan, goes above and beyond to help. The story inverts cultural expectations and then bids the lawyer to apply Torah equitably. The conclusion is two-fold. First, the lawyer recognizes that applying merciful love in any situation constitutes the double-love commandment. Second, he must recognize that he is clinging to cultural assumptions that apply merciful love in limited ways, and that limited love contradicts God's double-love command. ~Eric J. Wagner, CR

SCRIPTURE INSIGHTS: 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

The themes for this week's readings focus on living out God's word in everyday life. The readings encourage faith in action, love for others, and seeing Christ as the center of all creation.

- Obeying God's Word: God's commandments are clear and close to us. The first reading reminds us that following God's will is not beyond our reach.
- Christ at the Center: The second reading highlights Jesus as the foundation of creation and our faith. Everything exists through Him and is united in Him.
- Loving Your Neighbor: The Gospel calls us to love others, especially those in need. The story of the Good Samaritan challenges us to show kindness and mercy.
- Faith in Action: Faith is not just about knowing God's Word. The readings show that faith comes alive when we live it out through our actions.
- **Compassion for Others:** The Good Samaritan shows ٠ what compassion looks like. True love for God means caring for people, even strangers or those we find hard to love.
- God's Word is Close: The first reading teaches that God's Word is already in our hearts. We can live it out if we listen and choose to follow it.
- Jesus as the Source of Unity: The second reading shows Jesus as the one who holds all things together. Our faith unites us with Him and with one another.

On the 15th Sunday of Ordinary Time, we are reminded to live our faith through love and action. God's Word is near to us, and Jesus calls us to serve others with compassion and care.
