Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

Today's Gospel presents Jesus' parable on the dishonest steward. This passage has been the subject of much discussion as scholars and theologians wrestle with the meaning of these verses, in particular the verses commending the steward's actions. There are some interpretations of this parable that view the steward's reduction of the promissory notes as him forgoing his own commission rather than impacting the actual amount owed to the master. This is in keeping with the master's commendation. Otherwise, it seems more likely that the master would have imprisoned the steward for theft or loss of income rather than commending him. It is worth noting that although the master commends the steward, he does not offer him his job back. The master's words are a recognition of the effectiveness of the steward's actions that secured him friends and potential future employment.

It is important to keep in mind that Jesus is not advocating dishonest practices with this parable. Instead, he is highlighting the shrewdness of the steward. As Christians, we should exhibit this same level of shrewdness in pursuing holiness. Part of this shrewdness includes knowing that cheating others or God will not lead to a holy life. Rather, we should act in ways that will make us holy.

We are encouraged in our pursuit of holiness by Jesus' explanatory words after the parable concludes. Instead of clinging to material wealth, we should be good stewards of whatever material wealth we have been given. Material goods and God cannot hold the same place of importance in our priorities. We need to decide which one will be our life's pursuit. As Christians, the correct response to material wealth is to understand that it is not ours, but God's. For this reason, almsgiving is an important aspect of Christian living.

True wealth in Christianity does not refer to material goods but to the gift given to us by God, a gift that does not fail us when we die. It is the gift of eternal life, made possible through the redemptive suffering of Jesus on the cross and his resurrection from the dead. Our proper management of the material wealth entrusted to us in this life should reflect our identity as children of God's heavenly kingdom and point others to that holy reward.





SCRIPTURE INSIGHTS: 25TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR C

This week's readings call us to reflect on our use of worldly resources and our responsibilities to others. The readings challenge us to live with honesty, justice, and faithfulness to God above all else.

- Justice for the Poor: The first reading reminds us that God cares about the poor and condemns cheating and exploitation. We are called to treat others with fairness and care for those in need.
- **Honesty in Daily Life:** The Gospel warns against dishonesty, and urges us to act with integrity. God sees how we handle small things, and our choices reveal our loyalty to Him.
- Prioritizing God over Wealth: Jesus teaches that we cannot serve both God and money. We must decide where our true allegiance lies and choose what leads to eternal life.
- **Prayer for All People:** The second reading encourages us to pray for everyone, including leaders and those in authority. This reminds us that peace and order come from God's guidance and our prayers.
- Responsible Use of Resources: The Gospel challenges us to use our talents and possessions wisely for God's kingdom. Earthly goods are tools for doing good and helping others.
- Faithful Service To God: Jesus calls us to be faithful in our responsibilities. By serving God with sincerity, we show our love and trust in Him.
