

Third Sunday of Advent

December 14th, 2025

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

Like last Sunday, John the Baptist figures prominently in today's Gospel passage. In this account, however, we are at a much later point in John's life. The story unfolds in three basic parts. First, we see him in prison. This means John's death is near. Yet he still enjoys enough freedom to hear about Jesus' accomplishments. In this way, we learn that the "works of the Christ" (for whom John prepared a way with his baptism) signify true freedom. They are not hindered by imprisonment. In fact, recognizing the potential meaning of Jesus' actions, John dispatches messengers to ascertain with greater certainty the nature of Jesus' identity.

The scene then shifts to Jesus' exchange with those messengers. While John sent a simple binary question— are you the Christ or not?- Jesus offers a more circumspect response. He bids John's messengers to report what they have seen and heard Jesus accomplish. As if to prompt their report, Jesus lists some examples of what He has done. This list undoubtedly signals (in part) some of the transformative works performed by the Lord in today's first reading, from Isaiah. By dispatching the messengers back to John with this list, Jesus exhibits great trust in John's ability to discern its meaning. By extension, Jesus expresses significant respect for John's preparatory role in salvation.


The third part of the reading then shifts to Jesus addressing crowds around Him. He aims to clarify John's identity and significance in God's saving work. With a series of seemingly rhetorical questions, Jesus bids His audience to consider the Baptist and his ministry. By highlighting John's remoteness and lack of quality in his attire, Jesus emphasizes that John was no royal figure. He held no elevated social status. Rather, he was a prophet. But John's uniquely preparatory prophetic task rendered him more elevated than any royalty. Still, in a final twist, Jesus highlights the great grace of being counted as a member of the kingdom of heaven—its least member is more illustrious than John in his earthly ministry.



THEMES: THIRD WEEK OF ADVENT, YEAR A

Gaudete Sunday is a time of joyful anticipation. The readings focus on hope, patience, and recognizing God's presence among us.

- **Joy in God's Promise:** The readings show that God's promise brings joy. Isaiah speaks of the desert blooming, and Jesus points to His works as signs of God's presence.
- Patience in Waiting: James calls for patience as we wait for the Lord. Like a farmer waiting for crops, we must trust that God's timing is perfect.
- **Hope for Healing:** Isaiah promises healing for the blind, the deaf, and the lame. Jesus' miracles in the Gospel show that He fulfills this promise.
- **The Lord is Near:** The nearness of God brings hope. Jesus reminds John's disciples that He is the one they are waiting for.
- Signs of the Messiah: Jesus points to His works as signs of the Messiah. The miracles He performs fulfill the prophecies in Isaiah.
- **Encouragement in Trials:** James encourages us to stay strong through challenges. Like the prophets, we are called to endure with hope and patience.

Gaudete Sunday reminds us that our waiting is filled with joy and hope. As we prepare for Christ's coming, we trust in God's promises and His perfect timing. (YoungCatholics.com)
