REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

In today's Gospel, John highlights the magnitude of God's love. We see here in this love connections to the first reading, with its emphasis on God's mercy, and the second reading, with its final blessing that emphasizes "the love of God".

John unpacks the depth and significance of God's love in the verses we hear today. In the first reading, God deals with the wayward Israelites, showing more mercy than punishment, no matter how much they might merit God's anger. Yet, in this Gospel passage, God's love exceeds even these bounds as he gives his only Son so that the world might be reconciled to him again. God grants the gift of salvation—eternal life—through his Son. This eternal life entails participating in the divine life of the Trinity, a reality we see highlighted throughout John's Gospel and in today's second reading.

This gift of salvation can only be accepted through faith in Christ. Therefore, John goes on to explain that those who do not have faith condemn themselves. It is not Jesus who condemns, since he comes not to condemn but to save. In other words, we have free will to accept or refuse the gift of salvation. But a response is needed; we cannot remain neutral before the gift of God's Son. Thus, faith is accepting Jesus and the gift of salvation, working with him in this transformation within us, and proclaiming the good news that others might enjoy eternal life.

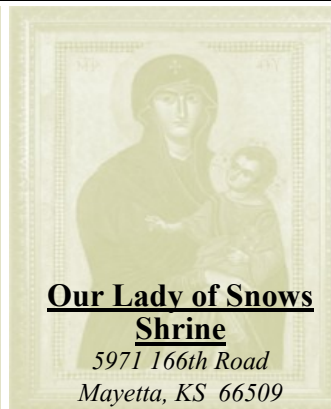
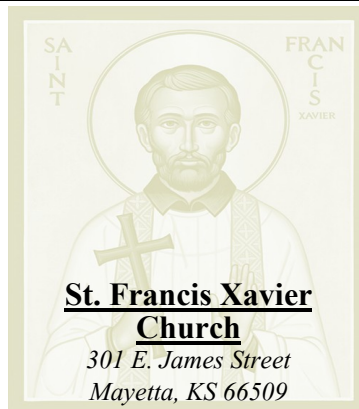
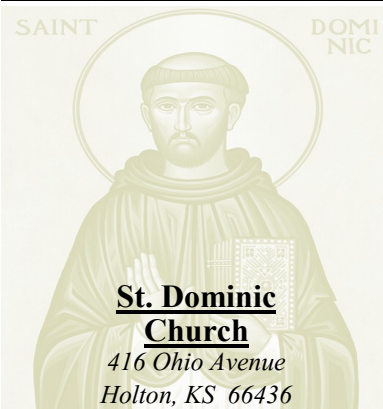

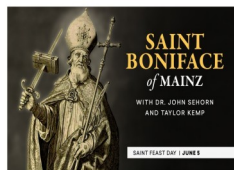
Lectio: God

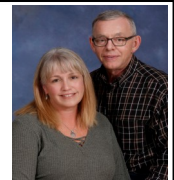
